Dumpster and Recycling Guidelines

(last updated: 08/03/2020)



This guideline was written to help minimize the amount of garbage being placed in the Morgan Lake dumpster causing an overflow situation and attracting animals. The weekly dumpster pickup is Thursday between 9 am and 9:30 am.

MLOA Bi-Laws state...*All garbage must be placed inside the designated refuse container. If the container is full, garbage may not be left outside the container. The refuse container is for garbage only. Any other items such as construction materials, furniture, appliances, or large items may not be disposed of using the refuse container.*



Typically, items too large for the dumpster include:

- Building Material/demolition debris (lumber, windows, siding, gutters, shingles, etc...)
- Brick, stone, concrete, and asphalt
- Drywall
- Appliances and Furniture Items
- Carpeting, padding, and flooring material
- Large unbroken-down boxes
- Yard Waste
- Tires
- Drums/large containers
- Propane tanks
- Mattress/Box Springs

These items can be brought to Great American Disposal's Niagara Transfer Station at W7450 Towns Road in Niagara. Phone: 715-251-1616. Their hours of operations are Mon-Fri 8:00 am – 3:30 pm; and Sat 9:00 am – 12 pm.

Household Hazardous Waste

Every few years Marinette County hosts a Clean-Sweep where residents can drop off household hazardous waste. However the last one was hosted in 2019 and not expected again for a few years. Household hazardous waste can be brought to the Brown County Resource Recovery Dept at 2561 South Broadway Ave, Green Bay. Hours of Operation: Thur 12 pm-6 pm; Sat 8 am – 2 pm. (Summer Only: Tue 9 am – 3 pm). Questions can be directed to Chris Blan at 920-492-4950, ext 4954. The 2020 costs for disposal of this type of waste is \$1.00/lb.

Scrap (limit 2ft x 2ft; 35lbs)	Rinse Clean	Cardboard-Sided Cans
All Paper Products	Newspapers, Magazines, Cardboard, Card Stock, Office Paper, Books-hardcover (covers removed), Envelopes, Cereal & Food and Beverages Boxes, Computer Printouts, File Folders, Glued Pads, Tablets, Phone Books, Post-it Notes, Milk & Juice Cartons, Wrapping Paper (no foil or ribbon), Junk Mail, Shredded Paper (must be in paper bag & stapled close), Empty Paper Towel & Toilet Paper Rolls.	Break Down all Large Items to Maximize Space.	Bathroom Waste Paper, Carbon Paper, Cellophane, Cloth, Cork, Foil, Waxed anything, Candy Wrappers, Napkins, Photographs, Fiberboard, Labels and Label Backings.
